

Great news! NSW Premier Mike Baird is set to end greyhound racing

Dear Friends,

They didn't stand a chance.

<u>For years in Australia, small animals</u> <u>like rabbits, piglets and possums</u> <u>were torn apart in a ghoulish kind</u> <u>of "bloodtraining.</u>" Strung up with rope and whirled around a makeshift track, they were used as live bait by



greyhound trainers looking to increase the prey drive of racing dogs. Investigators found that owners would pay "extra" for animals that squealed or fought back. Even mothers and their newborns were not spared:

A mother possum is tied down to a lure arm, her little joey still on her back. Twenty-six laps later, she is still alive. The grieving mother has been snapped in half, her spinal cord severed. An onlooker remarks: "It's crying. It's lost its baby." Tom Noble, owner of the track, just laughs.

Any greyhound that did not show interest in the chase could be bludgeoned or shot and thrown into a "wastage" pile. Or just left to starve to death ...

But now, the cruelty of greyhound racing Down Under has suffered its first major legislative challenge! On July 7, Premier Mike Baird announced that dog racing must end. Moved by the video exposé of live lure baiting and an official report showing that as many as 68,000 greyhounds have simply disappeared from record, he took decisive action. As I write this letter to you, the NSW Parliament is voting on his bill.

for the greyhounds in Dublin, Ireland

A few weeks ago, I had the honor to participate in the single biggest rally for grevhounds on record. More than 400 Irish greyhound advocates and their dogs joined guests from Australia, Italy, Macau, the United Kingdom and the United States to oppose the export of greyhounds to China's infamous dog track, the Canidrome.

We delivered a petition with over 300,000 signatures to Agriculture Minister Michael Creed and the rally ended with a march to the doors of Ireland's Parliament where our board member Albano Martins and I went inside to address a panel of lawmakers. As a result, no greyhounds have been exported to race and die in Macau ever since.

What's more, our campaign to close the Canidrome itself is closer than

ever to success. The Chief Executive has just announced that this awful place must go. <u>Citing local public concern</u> and worldwide pressure, Mr. Chui Sai On realized that a **death trap for dogs** is not good for the reputation of Macau. We are truly looking forward to rescuing the hundreds of greyhounds who will soon be set free!

One thing we have learned is that there are no borders when it comes to hurting innocent greyhounds. China's only dog track had no adoption group and no dog ever got out alive. It was a slaughterhouse for greyhounds. It is now closing because people like you from around the world joined hands and hearts to speak for the dogs.

Back in the United States, you and I know that greyhound racing is also cruel and inhumane and that the American industry is in freefall. There is still a lot of work ahead, but the latest figures show a decline of almost 70% since our work together began in 2001! In June, Arizona became the 40th American state to reject this activity and closed down its last dog track after the unanimous passage of our bill to prohibit dog racing. We must now keep campaigning until the eighteen remaining tracks close in Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Iowa and West Virginia, too.
