Greyhounds are intelligent, loyal and good-natured.

They are easily housetrained, shed only slightly and rarely bark.

Adults stand between 23 and 30 inches at the shoulder and weigh 50 to 85 pounds.



Called "45-mile-per-hour couch potatoes," rescued greyhounds require little exercise and spend most of their time napping around the house.

Ex-racers make excellent family friends, even for apartment dwellers, and simply require the same regular walks that all dogs do.

Greyhounds come in many sizes and colors and have different personalities. The most important factor to consider when adopting is the suitability of any individual dog to your own lifestyle and family situation.

The cruelty of greyhound racing is a global problem. Commercial dog tracks operate in Australia, Ireland, Mexico, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, the United States and Vietnam.

Since our formation in 2001, we have helped to close down dozens of dog tracks around the world, including China's only legal dog track the Canidrome. We have also blocked the expansion of this cruel activity to countries including the Philippines and South Africa.

Partnering with other non-profits across the world, we are now focused on saving greyhounds everywhere.

Racing Dogs Endure Confinement

At commercial racetracks, greyhounds are kept in warehouse-style kennels inside stacked cages that are barely large enough for them to stand up or turn around. They run on the hottest days of summer and the coldest days of winter. Thousands are killed each year after they are no longer profitable.

Greyhounds Suffer Serious Injuries

Greyhounds are frequently hurt while racing. The most common injuries are broken legs. Other injuries include seizures, head trauma, paralysis and death from cardiac arrest. Some dogs are even electrocuted.

Profits Come Before Welfare

The daily diet and veterinary treatment that dogs receive is dependent on economics. Each greyhound is bred as a short-term investment and once a dog suffers a serious injury or is no longer fast enough to win, that greyhound becomes a financial liability and must go.

Other Animals Suffer

Greyhounds are sometimes trained with live animals including rabbits, piglets and possums. Animals used as bait experience incredible pain before dying. According to the New South Wales, Australia government, as much as 20% of greyhound trainers relied on this cruel practice for years.

Dogs Test Positive for Drugs

Racing greyhounds regularly test positive for drugs including cocaine, as well as the muscle enhancer ractopamine and the industrial solvent dimethyl sulfoxide. In America, female racing dogs are routinely given an anabolic steroid to prevent them from going into heat. These drugs are harmful to dogs, and also call into question the integrity of wagers placed at dog tracks.



Legislate

We work to pass stronger greyhound protection laws and prohibit dog racing in the United States and around the world.



Increase Awareness

We continually document the cruelty of dog racing through reports, conferences, petitions, action alerts and social media.



Promote Adoption

We regularly support greyhound adoption organizations and contribute financially to rescuing dogs as tracks close.
